Agenda item 13 “Co7-06-16, Economic Development Authority of the Tohono O’Odham Nation-W. Old Ajo Hwy Plan Amendment”

Lee Bachman, TT&SC President gave the presentation regarding our club history, current functions, and the need for shooting range protection laws.

Based upon a recommendation by Pima County Administrator, Chuck Huckelberry, this request to amend the Comprehensive Plan was sent back to the Pima County Planning & Zoning Staff for modification.

The Board of Directors of the TT&SC would like to thank each person who contacted their County Supervisor in support of our club and in opposition to this proposed Comprehensive Plan amendment. We have the attention of the entire Pima County Board of Supervisors!

We will remain involved in the Planning & Zoning Staff planning process and will notify you when to contact P&Z with your input and concerns. The Pima County P&Z Commissioners will seek public input during this review process.

The Tucson Trap & Skeet Club’s Board of Directors official position is no residential development adjacent to our facility. High density residential housing is just not compatible and will lead to noise complaints, safety concerns, lighting complaints, lawsuits by adjacent homeowners, etc. We are not anti-growth! We would consider any compatible commercial, light industrial, manufacturing, self-storage or school bus parking-maintenance shop. In other words, a neighbor closed on weekends and evenings.
